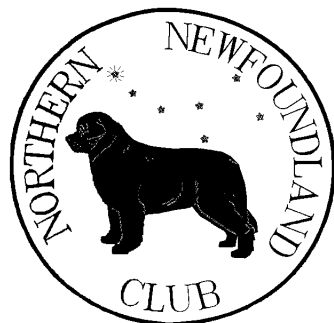

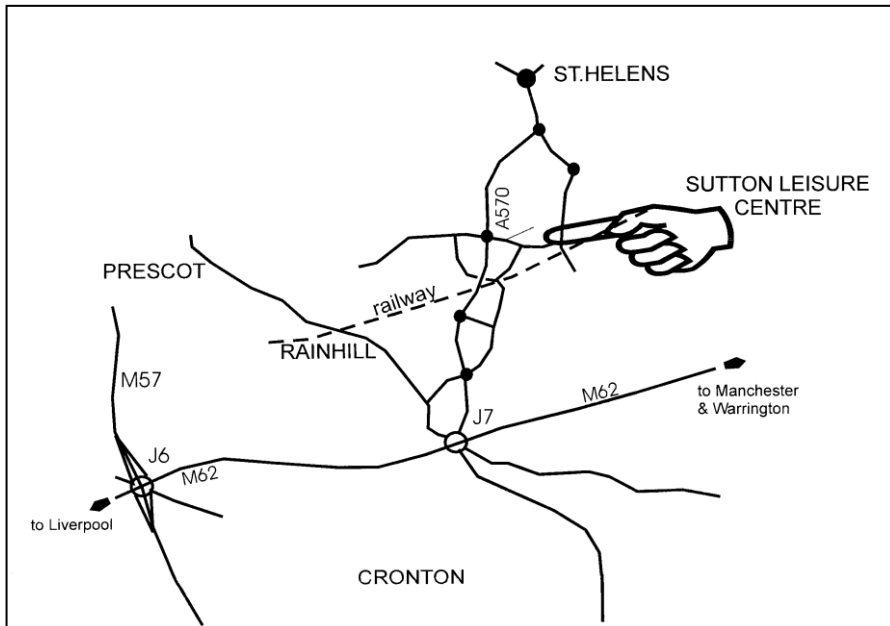

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members' classes or competing for members' specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. 25h February 2012

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) Transfer

(a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Minor Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Junior: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Yearling: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Novice: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not)

Graduate: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Post Graduate: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

Limit: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

Open: For all dogs of the breed s for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

Special Open: As for Open except restricted with regard to colour

Veteran: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show

Special Veteran: For dogs of not less than nine years of age on the day of the show

Brace: For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than brace or team

Not for Competition: Societies may at their discretion accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society. (See Rule 18)

The Kennel Club Breeders' Competition 2012

The Breeders' Competition offers the following Awards:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC classes 1st, 2nd, and 3rd

Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

Grand Final at Crufts 2013

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of four dogs of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	3 points
Second place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	2 points
Third place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	1 point
Best Breeder in Group	4 points
Second place Breeder in Group	3 points
Third place Breeder in Group	2 points
Fourth place Breeder in Group	1 point

The Breeders who have amassed a minimum of 25 points over a calendar year will qualify for the Final/Semi-final in the following year. It is not a requirement to withdraw from the competition upon reaching 25 points. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the Crufts Final.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 8.30 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the show management
6. Entry fees: **Non-Members** £22.00 per dog first class; **Members** £18.00 per dog first class; subsequent entries with same dog Non-Members £2.50, Members £2.00; *If a dog is registered in partnership at the Kennel Club, both owners MUST be Club members to qualify for the members' discount* Brace £2.50 per brace; Not for Competition £1.50 per dog. Catalogues prepaid with entries £2.50, limited number at the show £3.00. Catalogue advertisements full page £10.00, half page £6.00. Membership Joint £22.00, Single £19.00
7. There is no Prize Money on offer at this show but Rosettes and Prize Cards will be on offer for 1st to V.H.C. in all classes. Other trophies, rosettes and specials listed elsewhere in this schedule will also be on offer. Trophies are for members only, unless otherwise stated
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden
11. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of the Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and are unbeaten by any other puppy.
Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition
Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. **Best in Show** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition
Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition)
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. **DOGS IN CARS**
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Please take care of your dog.

- Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. We welcome all other breeds to our show provided that they are entered Not for Competition, are at least six months old on the day of the show and they MUST be registered with the Kennel Club.
 19. The show will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted
 20. Entry fees will not be refunded. Returned cheques will not be re-presented and for any cheque that is refused by the bank for any reason whatsoever, there will be an additional handling charge of £10.00 and any dog(s) entered will be excluded from the show. Any subsequent non-payment in full by cash or postal order only, will be referred to the Kennel Club after 21 days from the date of the show.
 21. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance except by permission of the Committee of the Kennel Club.
 22. All dogs must be registered at the Kennel Club before the closing date for entries.
 23. Whilst everything will be done to ensure that a competitor will be in the ring on time, the Club cannot be held responsible for any missed class,
 24. Should a Judge being prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another in his or her place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees will be returned.
 25. The Club will not be held responsible for accidents to persons or dogs at the show.
 26. All Rules and Regulations or definitions and instructions of the nature of Rules and Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this schedule shall be deemed to be the regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these regulations.
 27. Exhibitors passes will not be sent out. Anybody who wishes to receive acknowledgement of entries should enclose a S.A.E. when entering.
 28. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' Classes, competing for Members' Specials or entering classes at Member's reduced entry fees each partner must at the time of entry, be a member of the Northern Newfoundland Club
 29. Prepaid catalogues will only be reserved until 12 Noon on the day of the show.
 30. The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at this show and remind exhibitors grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
 31. Any owner, Competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any litter, loose hair or fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Parents and Guardians please note: well behaved children are very welcome but parents/guardians or those in charge of children will be held responsible for their behaviour. Children may not cause any damage to the venue nor any annoyance nor discomfort to other people or dogs.
 32. The word 'dog' used anywhere in this schedule may include both sexes
 33. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers or any one for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers of the Dog Show, the Kennel Club, the Venue Owners, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss or damage, injury or illness to dogs, owners, exhibitors, professional handlers, spectators and/or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.

34. Exits and Fire Doors are not to be obstructed. Dogs on leads may not have their leads attached to any part of such doors
35. The Show Management is empowered to exclude any dog which, in their opinion, is not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice, natural or other causes, without giving reason, and if such exclusion takes place before or after the dog is judged, the entry fee(s) will be forfeited.
36. The Organisers shall not be liable in respect of any loss or damage whatsoever arising from the abandonment, cancellation or postponement of the Dog Show or any such eventuality.
37. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club Licensed Events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
38. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered and recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency.
39. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm.

Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulation will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2.
 - a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog, may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
 - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
