

Show Judges' List 2010/2011. CRITERIA .

The Committee's agreed Minimum Criteria for the Club's Judging Lists have changed. These changes were agreed in Committee on 13 June 2010 and will come into force once approved by The Kennel Club.

A1 List.

For persons who have :

- previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award CC's in the breed,
- have completed their first appointment and
- have the support of the NNC Club.

A2 List.

For persons who:

- fulfil the requirements for the A3 List ,
- who have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and accepted by the Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 List , and
- have the support of the Club.

A3 List (Breed Specialists).

For persons who:

- Have a minimum of SEVEN years judging experience.
- Have the support of the Club.
- To have judged the breed at EIGHTEEN Open Shows or Championship Shows without C.C's with an adequate geographical spread.
- To have judged a minimum of SIXTY classes.
- To have judged a minimum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY dogs.
- To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer, and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures.
- To have attended both a Conformation and Movement seminar and passed the "Hands on Assessment " given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer.
- To have attended at least ONE Breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant K.C. Code of Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable.
- To have bred and/or owned a minimum of THREE dogs when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
- To have stewarded at TWELVE shows over a minimum THREE year period.

A3 List. (Non Breed specialist.)

For persons who:

- Have a minimum of SEVEN years judging experience in any ONE breed (to include FIVE years in this breed).
- Have the support of the Club.
- To have judged the breed at EIGHTEEN Open Shows or Championship Shows without C.C's with an adequate geographical spread.
- To have judged a minimum of SIXTY classes in this breed.
- To have judged a minimum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY dogs in this breed.

- To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer, and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures.
- To have attended both a Conformation and Movement seminar and passed the “Hands on Assessment “ given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer.
- To have attended at least ONE Breed specific judging seminar run in accordance with the relevant K.C. Code of Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable.
- To have bred and/or owned a minimum of THREE dogs of any breed when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
- To have stewarded at TWELVE shows over a minimum THREE year period.

B List (Breed specialists).

For persons who have:

- FIVE years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed .
- the support of The Club.
- To have judged TWENTY classes of this breed at Open or Championship Shows without CC's.
- To have judged THIRTY dogs of this breed.
- To have attended ONE Breed specific Judging seminar.
- To have completed THREE stewarding appointments.

B List (Non Breed specialists).

For persons who have:

- A minimum of FIVE years judging experience in any ONE breed .
- the support of the Club.
- To have judged TWENTY classes of this breed at Open or Championship Shows without CC's.
- To have judged a minimum of THIRTY dogs of this breed.
- To have attended ONE Breed specific Judging seminar.
- To have completed THREE stewarding appointments.

C List (Breed specialist).

For aspirant judges who have :

- An interest in the Breed.
- the support of the Club.
- Owned the Breed for a minimum of THREE years.

C List (Non Breed specialist).

For aspirant judges who have :

- An interest in the Breed.
- the support of the Club.
- Must have owned a Kennel Club registered Breed for a minimum of THREE years.

THOSE PERSONS APPROVED TO BE ON THE A3, B and C LISTS MUST RECEIVE A MAJORITY VOTE OF TWO THIRDS OF COMMITTEE IN OFFICE AT THE TIME AND PRESENT AT THE MEETING WHEN NOMINATIONS WERE CONSIDERED.
